## Foothill College's Sexual Assault, including Rape, Educational Program(s)

- I. With prevention as the main emphasis, Foothill will develop and implement a variety of programs designed to educate the college community about sexual assault including rape. These programs will inform, promote discussion, and encourage reporting. Programs will be made available for classroom presentations, workshops, seminars, campaigns, plays, skits, and written materials. These programs will include:
  - A. The seriousness of the offenses of rape and other types of sexual assault.
  - B. Factual information regarding the prevalence of stranger and acquaintance rape, how and where it occurs, its impact, and the relationship of alcohol and drug use to sexual assault.
  - C. Prevention techniques.
  - D. Referral sources on and off campus.
- II. The materials to be purchased or developed will be culturally sensitive and will be distributed throughout campus, including displays for the classrooms, activities in the Campus Center, articles in the student newspaper, spots on the college television station, and special events and workshops. Materials will include videotapes, flyers, pamphlets, bookmarks, audio-visual presentations, and posters. These materials on rape and other types of sexual assault will be made available to the campus community through Campus Safety, the Counseling Division, Psychological Services, Health Services, the Face-It program, the Information Booth, and Student Activities, and will be made available for all new student orientations and for any college program our students are required to attend.
- III. Special seminars or workshops will be developed for the following groups:
  - A. All athletic coaches and administrators.
  - B. All athletic teams.
  - C. All officers or representatives of recognized student organizations and their advisors.
  - D. All student employees.
  - E. All visiting foreign students.
- IV. Annual seminars or workshops will be offered to staff of:
  - A. Student Services and Instruction.
  - B. Student Activities and Affairs.
  - C. Campus Safety.
- V. The college will write an annual report describing all the college's educational activities on sexual assault, and statistics about the number of on-campus sexual

assaults and where they occur. The report will be submitted to the College President.
