REGULAR MEETING

CALL TO ORDER

President Bechtel called the public session of the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees to order at 6:00 p.m. and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. Chancellor Thor reported that student trustee Adams was unable to attend the meeting due to illness.

<u>Foothill College President Judy Miner</u> reported positive enrollment numbers for both colleges and advised that the Foothill College Computer Science Department has increased enrollment by 77 percent as a result of adding 19 new courses.

<u>Chancellor Linda Thor</u> reminded trustees to attend District Opening Day, featuring a keynote speech by Dr. Mark Milliron, on September 19, 2013.

<u>Trustee Joan Barram</u> reported that there was a substantive discussion of issues facing higher education at the Silicon Valley Leadership Group Education Summit that she attended with President Bechtel, trustee Cheng, and Chancellor Thor.

<u>Trustee Pearl Cheng</u> added that California Community Colleges Chancellor Brice Harris, who participated on the summit's higher education panel, gave major kudos to Foothill-De Anza Community College District and Chancellor Thor at the event.

<u>President Betsy Bechtel</u> advised that in addition to Chancellor Harris, the higher education panel, which was moderated by Lockheed Martin Vice President Tory Bruno, featured University of California Provost and Executive Vice President Aimée Dorr, California State University Chancellor Timothy P. White, and University of Santa Cruz Chancellor George Blumenthal as panelists. She also indicated that Andrew Ng, co-founder and CEO of Coursera, gave examples of how massive open online courses (MOOCs) are serving as a resource to augment classroom instruction during his presentation at the event.

FOUNDATION BOARD REPORT

Trustee Barram reported that at the August 28, 2013, Foothill-De Anza Foundation Board of Directors meeting, De Anza College students involved in 350.org gave an impressive presentation asking the Foundation to divest from fossil fuel companies. She advised that the Foundation raised \$4.16 million in 2012-2013, hopes to raise \$4.84 million in 2013-2014, is making progress with the web redesign, and has developed a new brochure. Additionally, she indicated that new Foundation President Kathleen Santora shared her goals at the meeting, which included conducting a board evaluation and developing infrastructure and systems that make clear how the foundation is supporting students. On behalf of the Foundation Board, trustee Barram invited the district's governing board members to attend the Foundation holiday party on December 18, 2013.
