Under minimum supervision, perform technical work in the Biological and Health Sciences Division, including but not limited to Horticulture (HORT), Biotechnology (BTEC), Biology (BIOL) and Veterinary Technology (VT). Prepare and organize supplies and materials and assemble equipment for use in labs. Organize and set up demonstrations in a timely manner for various lab exercises. Maintain cleanliness in lab areas. Prepare, maintain and make minor repairs to lab and field equipment. Maintain records and inventory on equipment, tools and supplies and schedules. Maintain nursery, greenhouse, lath house, construction lab, gardens, and vehicles. Order, inventory, and issue lab equipment. Perform routine tests and experiments and maintain microbial cultures. Ensure compliance with regulations pertaining to HAZMAT, CAL/OSHA, USDA, Blood Borne Pathogens and Workplace Safety functions for the Biological and Health Sciences Division.
