DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POSITION INCLUDE:

Instruct community college lecture and laboratory chemistry courses to a diverse student population; courses range from introductory and allied health chemistry to general and organic chemistry. Plan, organize, and oversee curriculum development, select textbooks and materials for chemistry courses, including those which contain contributions to the discipline by ethnic groups and women when appropriate. Prepare laboratory schedules and participate in collaborative efforts to address safety, chemical handling, waste disposal, and departmental policies. Assist in the growth and success of a diverse population of students through careful preparation of course materials, effective teaching methodologies and informed critical feedback on assignments and discussions.

Standard duties expected of all faculty include development and evaluation of curricula, maintaining scheduled office hours, attending department and division meetings, pursuing professional growth activities, and performing other duties consistent with the role of an instructor. Instructors also have the opportunity to serve on District and college committees and participate in campus extra-curricular activities.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Understanding of, sensitivity to, and respect for the diverse academic, socio-economic, ethnic, religious, and cultural backgrounds, disability, and sexual orientation of community college students, faculty and staff.
- Master's degree in chemistry OR Bachelor's degree in chemistry or biochemistry AND Master's degree in biochemistry, chemical engineering, chemical physics, physics, molecular biology, or geochemistry, OR the equivalent.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Recent teaching experience at the secondary or postsecondary level in chemistry lecture and lab.
- 2. Experience in teaching college level chemistry in a variety of contexts including introductory, allied health, and general chemistry, with special interest in organic chemistry.
- 3. Experience with and commitment to working with culturally and ethnically diverse groups.

- 4. Hands-on experience with the maintenance and operation of instruments used in community college and research laboratories.
- 5. Experience with and knowledge of current hazardous material handling in a chemistry laboratory.
- 6. Professional experience in academic or industrial chemistry research.
- 7. Teaching pedagogy adaptable to a variety of learning styles.
- Current in chemical education as evidenced by course work, research, presentations and membership in professional chemical societies.
- 9. Interest in working with community organizations and local schools to promote chemical education and articulation at all levels.
