DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE POSITION INCLUDE:

Provide classroom instruction in Political Science courses using student-centered pedagogies. Teach a range of courses from within departmental offerings: Introduction to American Politics and Government, Comparative Politics, International Relations, Introduction to Political Thought, Women and Politics, State and Local Government, the Politics of Race, Social Movements, and Environmental Politics. Work towards the integration of civic engagement and community service learning into course offerings and student learning. Create an open arena to integrate the work of and issues relating to women, people of color, and comparative or non-Eurocentric sources. Develop strategies to meet the needs of a diverse student population. Facilitate and advocate for student retention and success, especially for those from traditionally disadvantaged groups.

Standard duties expected of all faculty include development and evaluation of curricula, maintaining scheduled office hours, attending department and division meetings, pursuing professional growth activities, and performing other duties consistent with the role of an instructor. Instructors also have the opportunity to serve on District and college committees and participate in campus extra-curricular activities.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Understanding of, sensitivity to, and respect for the diverse academic, socio-economic, ethnic, religious, and cultural backgrounds, disability, and sexual orientation of community college students, faculty and staff.
- Master's Degree in political science, government, public administration, or international relations, OR Bachelor's Degree in any of the above AND Master's Degree in economics, history, social science, sociology, any ethnic Studies, JD, or LL.B.; OR the equivalent.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Experience teaching Political Science using inclusive pedagogies and course content at the post-secondary level to students of ethnically and culturally diverse backgrounds.
- 2. Experience in developing and utilizing civic engagement or service learning strategies for student learning.
- Experience teaching the department's core offerings: Introduction to American Government and Politics; International

- Relations; Comparative Politics, and Political Thought and Theory.
- 4. Experience teaching one or more of the following: Women and Politics, Environmental Politics, Race and Politics.
- 5. Experience with integrating technology in the classroom and/or online teaching.
- Experience in or ability to teach California and local government classes.
- 7. Experience and/or ability in developing new curricula.

In addition, successful candidates will demonstrate the following:

- 1. The ability to use various teaching methods that engage students in their own learning, including methods that motivate students to develop their higher level thinking skills.
- 2. Ability to commit to the mission of De Anza College and its philosophy of education.
- Ability to demonstrate enthusiasm and interest in working cooperatively with colleagues in multiple departments and in serving on college committees in a shared governance organization.
