

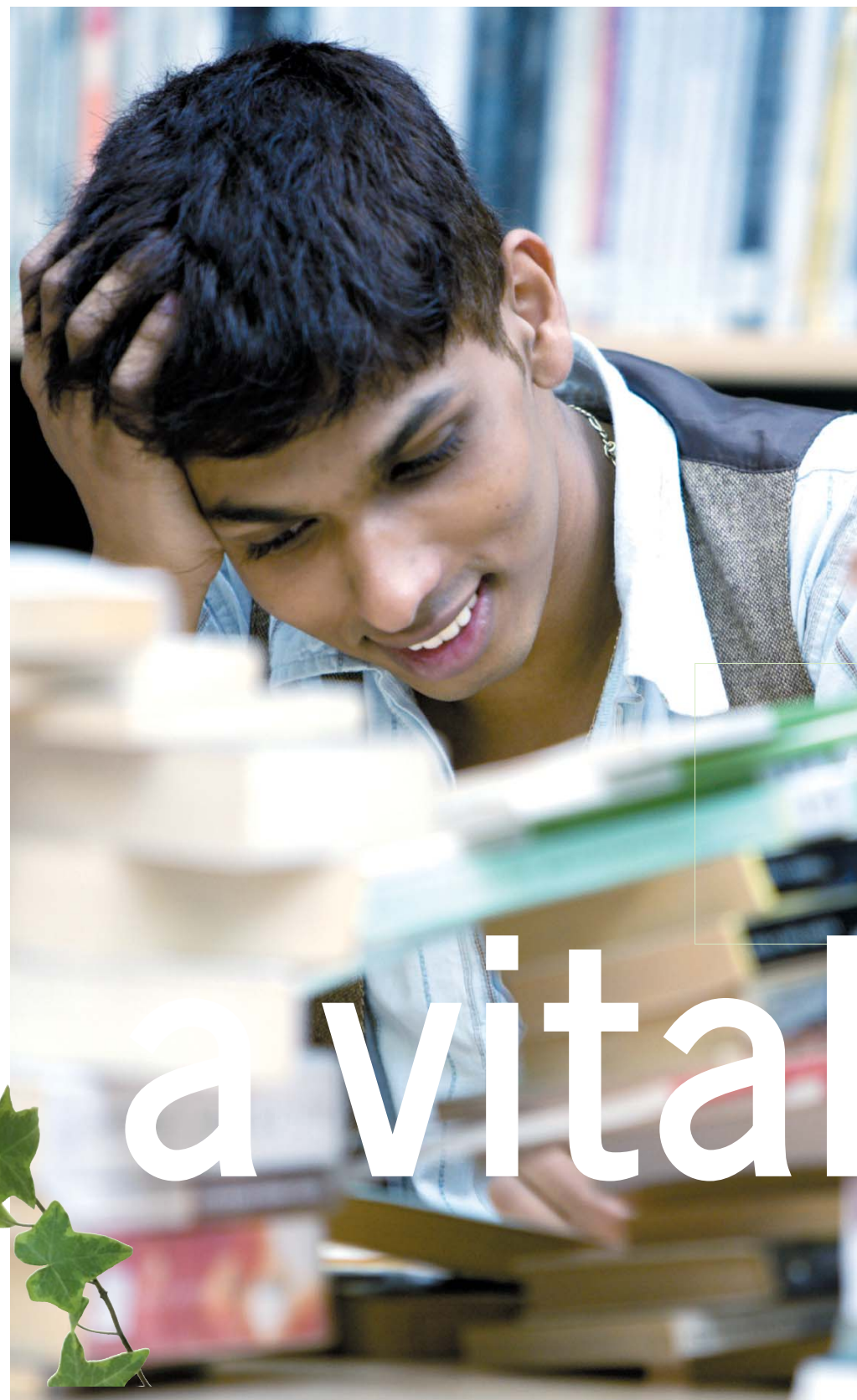

**Foothill and De Anza colleges** are members of the largest system of higher education in the world. California's 109 community colleges serve about 2.6 million students each year. More than two-thirds of students enrolled in California public higher education in 2006-07 attended a community college.

Foothill-De Anza enrolls about 44,000 students each fall, is the destination of choice for students seeking an outstanding and affordable lower-division education, and ranks as one of the leading community college districts in California for student transfers to four-year universities. The District is among the largest public employers in the Valley and contributes more than \$800 million annually to the local economy.

Foothill-De Anza fills a unique place within the region's educational system and must remain innovative and nimble to keep pace with rapidly changing workforce needs resulting from the retirements, immigration, and entrepreneurial developments that shape Silicon Valley.

The two colleges educate a significant number of Silicon Valley's nurses, paramedics, dental hygienists, medical and dental assistants, veterinary technicians, pharmacy and radiology technicians, diagnostic medical sonographers, EKG technicians, and other health care workers. They represent a critical resource in educating and advancing students to fill the Valley's mid-wage occupations, a key factor in the economic success of the region.

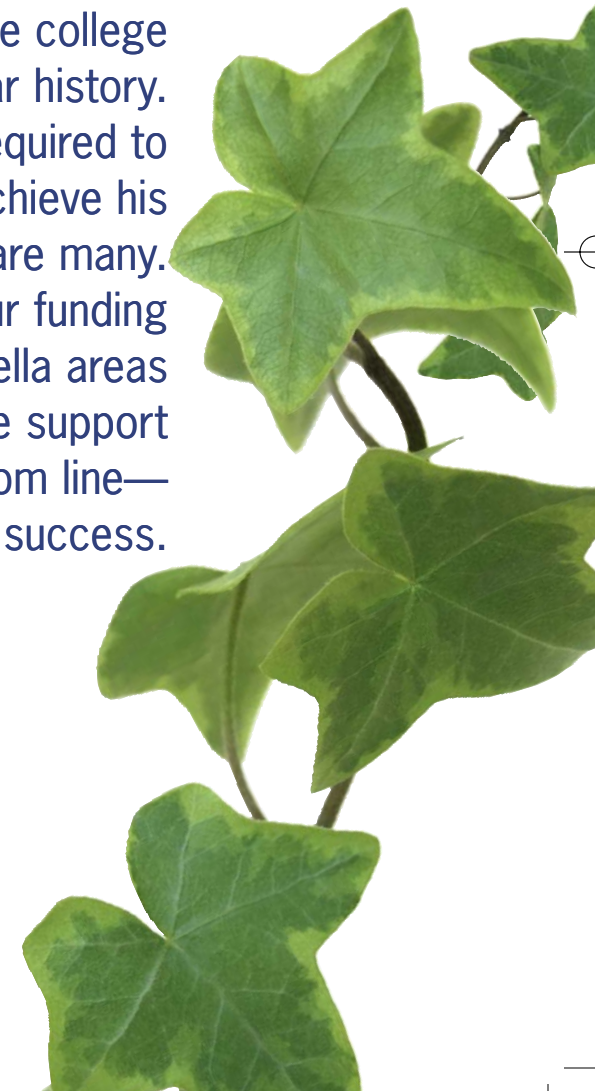
**excellence** provides the funding necessary to close the achievement gap among underprepared students as well as to ensure the next generation of leaders in science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and the arts. Excellence supports areas such as curriculum development to increase student success, the creation of open educational resources as an alternative to expensive textbooks, and advancement of distance learning, to name a few.

**opportunity** creates the financial assistance required by a great number of community college students to pursue their education. Opportunity helps with scholarships, book vouchers, and equipment necessary for students enrolled in specialized technical programs such as nursing and automotive technology. Opportunity also supports the workforce education programs that are critical to maintaining our community's economic health and wellbeing.

**innovation** fills the technology and equipment needs within the state-of-the-art facilities made possible through Measures E and C. Both colleges are embarking on the construction of a new generation of educational structures designed to meet the needs of today's students. Innovation also enables the colleges to remain current within such technology-rich programs as BioHealth and Applied Technologies.

**sustainability** establishes the venture funding that allows Foothill-De Anza to remain a model for environmental stewardship and education. Sustainability also promotes community and civic engagement, which allows the colleges to play a role in addressing regional issues and problems. Sustainability promotes lifelong learning for the community.

**Gay and Bill Krause: A Commitment to Community Education** For Gay and Bill Krause, learning never stops. Gay has spent her entire career in education—as a teacher, counselor, assistant principal, and principal in the Mountain View school system. Bill, the former CEO of 3Com Corp. and founder of several high-tech companies, has taken classes in German, French, statistics, and piano at Foothill for personal growth and to keep his skills up to date.

Their belief in the importance of education led the Los Altos Hills couple to provide support for the Krause Center for Innovation at Foothill College. They hope their leadership gifts will encourage others to join them in their efforts to endow the Center's teacher-in-residence program, acquire new technology and equipment, and provide scholarships for its summer stipend program.

The Krause Center provides hands-on training in technology for about 2,000 teachers and community members each year, who can then integrate these tools into their curricula. The Center also houses a multimedia center available to all Foothill students. "We both take our philanthropy very seriously and believe in the importance of giving back," says Gay, the executive director of the Krause Center for the past 10 years. "We are interested in the long term, and we think that teaching teachers will have the biggest influence on the future of our community."

Raised in Northern Virginia, Gay learned about philanthropy early on. "My family didn't have the extra money, but they taught me the philosophy behind giving. Bill and I are happy we're in a position to help this important program."

Through the years Gay has volunteered at several community organizations, including the Mid-Peninsula YMCA, Community Foundation Silicon Valley, and the Foothill-De Anza Foundation, and the family foundation provides support to Bill's alma mater, The Citadel. Gay is also involved in the Mountain View-Los Altos-Los Altos Hills Challenge Team, which brings together community members to address teen-oriented concerns. "I think it's important to be involved and to set an example to get others involved as well," says Gay. "I'm always out there plugging the value of community education—I'm a real salesperson for Foothill."

**Anonymous Support: Addressing Silicon Valley's Nursing Shortage** An anonymous Silicon Valley Community Foundation donor, concerned about the future of health care and the tremendous nursing shortage in the area, presented De Anza College with a \$1.08 million nursing education grant which was made in September 2006. The Silicon Valley Scholars Scholarship Fund will support disadvantaged residents interested in pursuing meaningful and rewarding careers.

This grant, which was made possible through the Silicon Valley Scholars Scholarship Fund, enables De Anza College to admit an additional six students per quarter over a five year period, educating an additional 66 registered nurses through its acclaimed program. "De Anza is deeply grateful for this gift," says college President Brian Murphy. "The grant's focus on supporting economically disadvantaged students will provide scores of opportunities for a rewarding and well-paying career."

Daniel Rockmeal and Myreen Tan are among the first students to receive scholarships through this outstanding gift. Daniel looks forward to receiving his RN degree to become an emergency room nurse where he can put all of his skills to use. He is also interested in Eastern medicine and would like to combine alternative medicine with his work as a nurse. Myreen had been working two jobs, six days a week, to support herself and to help pay for her coursework. She now looks forward to further specializing in intensive care nursing. "The scholarship has been a wonderful help in allowing me to spend more time on my studies," said Myreen.

"We deeply appreciate the donor's vision, foresight and generosity to De Anza College through the Silicon Valley Scholars Scholarship Fund," President Murphy adds. "Generous private gifts like this are creating the margin of excellence that marks De Anza College."

**Susan Jackson: The Love of Animals Fosters a Career** Over the years, Susan Jackson has provided generous support for Foothill College's Veterinary Technology program. Her giving began in 1992, when her daughter, Candy, was a member of the program's first graduating class. "The program really gave my daughter focus. She was always keen on animals, and the Vet Tech program enabled Candy to use her love of animals to further her career," Susan explains.

Susan recently toured Foothill's new 5,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art clinical training facility, which houses one of only seven such programs in the State of California and the only accredited AVMA program serving the greater San Francisco Bay Area. "I want to support other students like my daughter to further their career," adds Susan. She looks forward to a return visit with her daughter so Candy can see Foothill's showcase facility.

Led by Dr. Karl Peter, with the assistance of instructor Dr. Maureen MacDougall (shown at left with Susan Jackson), the Veterinary Technology Program at Foothill College is a two-year, fully accredited course of training preparing each student for employment as a Registered Veterinary Technician (RVT). "There is a high demand for Registered Vet Technicians," states Dr. Peter. He cites a recent survey by the Committee on Veterinary Technician Education and Activities showing the number of positions advertised is about 20 times higher than the number of qualified applicants. Foothill's Vet Tech program has graduated 326 students since Candy earned her degree 16 years ago.

Candy obtained her RVT license and now enjoys a very successful career in the biomedical industry. She returned part time to her research post at SRI International last year. She and her three young children (ages 9, 7 and 9 months) and four dogs live next door to Susan in Los Altos Hills. Susan, a devoted grandmother, manages a small private foundation that also grants financial support to programs serving battered women and abused children.





# sustainability

**Ben and Ruth Hammett: Planting the Seeds of Change** With four grown children and four active grandchildren, Ben and Ruth Hammett have a keen interest in the Earth's future health and well-being. For years the two have been involved in environmental organizations and take part in ecological studies when they travel. "I'm worried about the future," says Ben. "But I'm also hopeful because of the great surge of interest in global warming and environmental efforts, both here and in other countries. It's important that more people become involved."

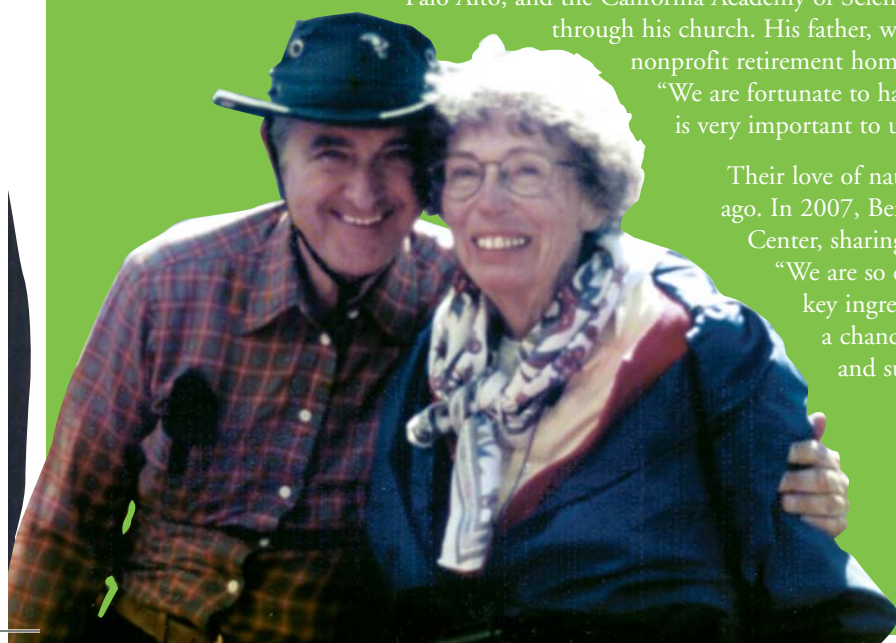
The Hammetts' ongoing support helped construct the Kirsch Center for Environmental Studies at De Anza College, a building that incorporates some of the most innovative technologies for sustainability and energy use. Their gifts also sustain the department's educational programs for students interested in understanding the social and economic aspects of protecting the Earth's resources. "We feel connected to that building because we watched it being built from a number of materials, each of which teaches an environmental lesson. The Kirsch Center is a model that other campuses should follow," says Ben. "Both the building and the students represent a new kind of leadership, the kind that will make a real difference."

Ben, a retired clinical psychologist, is a long-time volunteer at organizations like the National Parks Conservation Association, Acterna in Palo Alto, and the California Academy of Sciences, and he is currently involved in an interfaith environmental education program through his church. His father, who founded the Santa Barbara Museum of Art, and his mother, who established a nonprofit retirement home and rehabilitation center, taught him the importance of philanthropy at a young age. "We are fortunate to have the chance to help others," Ben says. "It allows us to be proactive about an issue that is very important to us, and we feel empowered by helping the students. There's nothing more inspiring."

Their love of nature inspired Ben and Ruth to honeymoon in Yosemite National Park more than 50 years ago. In 2007, Ben took a trip to Alaska to study global warming, and twice was a guest lecturer at the Kirsch Center, sharing his observations of the effects of climate change on a Barrier Island village.

"We are so excited that we can help give young folks the chance to learn about biodiversity and the key ingredients of leadership," says Ben. "It struck me that De Anza has given so many students a chance to turn their lives around. We are helping move people into careers in environment and sustainability who may make all the difference to our futures."

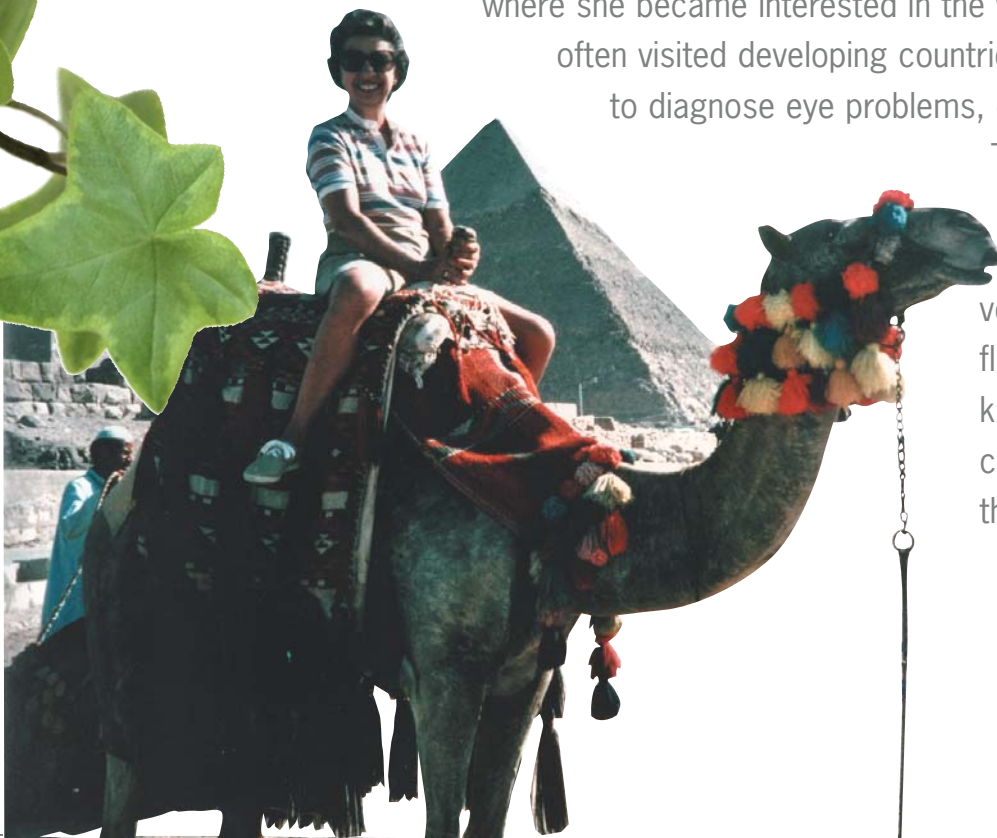
### **The Galina Family Endowed Scholarship: Making Opportunities in Health and Veterinary Sciences**

A generous bequest from the Seymour Galina and Diane Louise Galina Family Trust, totaling nearly \$750,000, will now provide scholarships in perpetuity to students studying health and veterinary sciences at both Foothill and De Anza colleges. Nanci Mason, a Foothill College alumna, is trustee of the Galina bequest and was a close friend with Diane Galina who, she says, was like a second mother to her. "Diane cared deeply about education, children, and animals," says Nanci. "She was a strict, no-nonsense grammar-school teacher who wanted only the best for her students."

The Galinas were active Los Altos residents who enjoyed traveling to spots off the beaten path. Diane, a fluent Spanish speaker, was interested in Hispanic cultures and spent time in Latin American countries, where she became interested in the welfare of women. Sy, a Los Altos optometrist, and Diane often visited developing countries with Volunteer Optometric Services to Humanity (VOSH) to diagnose eye problems, distribute eyeglasses, and assist with eye care.

This bequest will offer scholarships in perpetuity for students who struggle financially to participate in health science-related courses of study as well as veterinary technology. "Diane always had a Benji-type, fluffy dog at her side," says Nanci. "She would be proud to know that her and Sy's estate will help secure the future for countless Foothill and De Anza students as well as provide the community with well educated healthcare professionals."

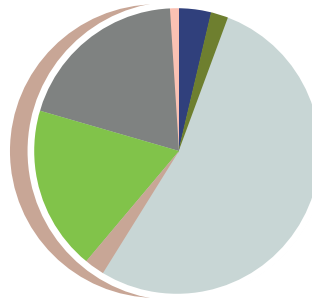

**The Gift of an Education:** In 2006-2007, more than 930 scholarships were awarded at both Foothill and De Anza colleges—totaling nearly \$900,000. “A significant number of Foothill and De Anza students come from low-income homes and are often the first in their families to attend college,” says Chancellor Martha Kanter. “Since nearly two-thirds of them must work to support themselves, scholarships become critical in helping our students realize their educational dreams.”

Sandra Lwee was the 2006-2007 recipient of the Scholarship for Veterans. Sandra is the eldest of four children in a family that emigrated from Burma in 1991. Education is highly valued in the Lwee family, but since they struggled to gain a financial foothold in the U.S., Sandra joined the Navy to support her studies. After serving tours of duty in “Operation Enduring Freedom” and “Operation Iraqi Freedom,” Sandra returned to De Anza College to resume her education. She is now at UC San Diego studying chemical engineering as a McNair Scholar and plans to enter a Ph.D. program upon graduation.

Sandra is not the only one in her family with ties to De Anza. Her brother is attending De Anza. Her sister attended De Anza and transferred to San Jose State and Sandra’s father, who previously held minimum wage jobs, earned a certificate at De Anza in autoCAD drafting. “It was a life-changing decision,” Sandra said.

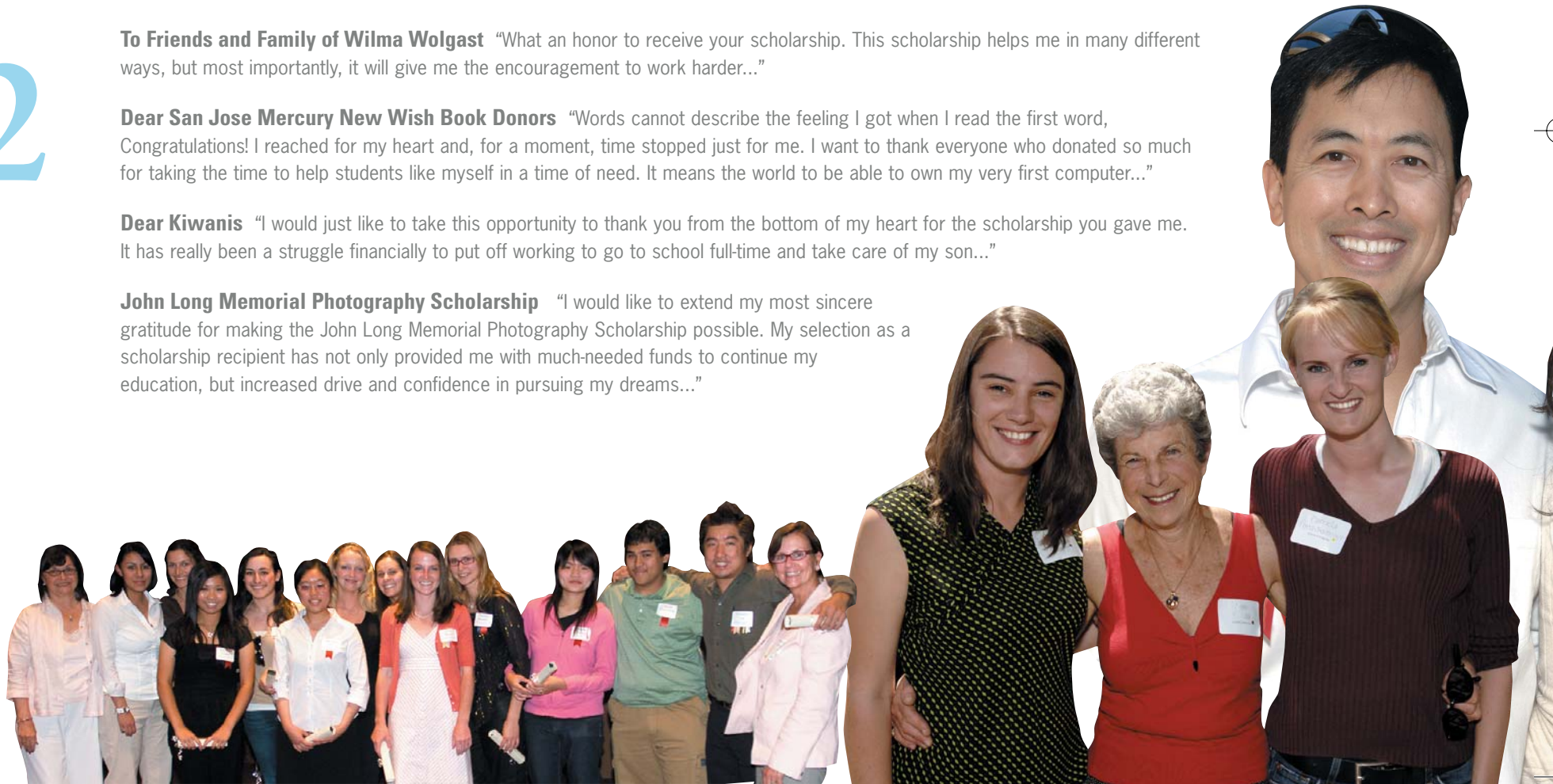

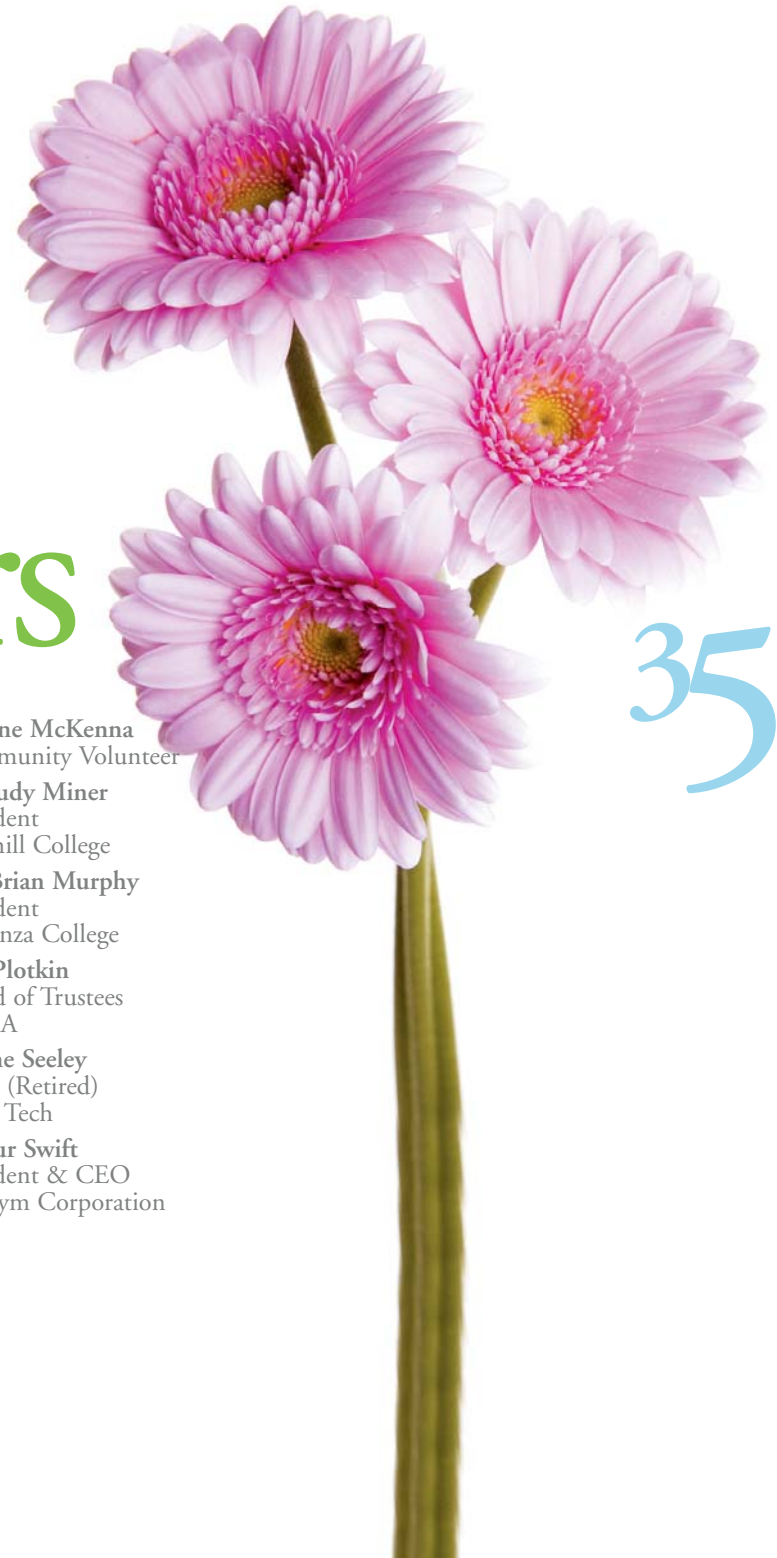
